



Invitation to enrol

Review of proton pump inhibitor (PPI) prescribing

Your opportunity to:

- identify patients using PPI therapy with inadequate control of dyspeptic symptoms
- become familiar with indications for 'test and treat' for *Helicobacter pylori* infection, and review whether this has been undertaken in patients where appropriate
- determine appropriate duration of PPI use for a range of clinical conditions and identify patients suitable for step-down of therapy
- reflect on education provided to patients to address potential rare but serious adverse effects associated with PPI therapy
- compare your practice to current guidelines and your peers, using the immediate feedback provided.

Patient inclusion criteria

Identify 20 patients who are:

- using a proton pump inhibitor
- older than 16 years of age
- *not* pregnant
- *not* using a PPI as part of eradication therapy for *H. pylori* infection.

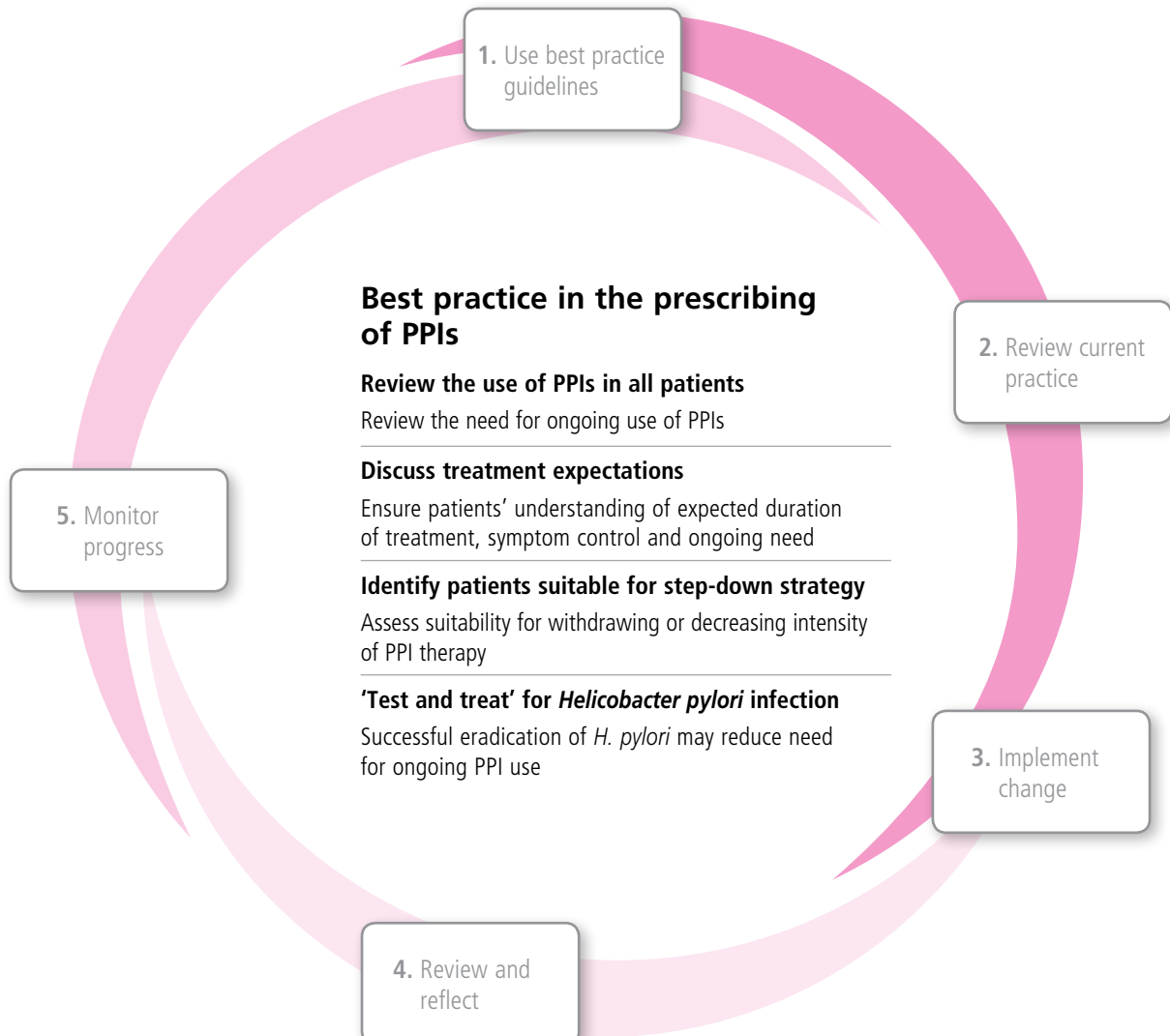
