Educational visits

30-minute facilitated in-practice discussion tailored to GPs' learning needs. Different therapeutic approaches and the choices available are discussed one-on-one with an independent NPS MedicineWise Educational Visitor. Also available as virtual visits via video call.



PBS/MBS Practice Reviews

Provide individual GPs with data on dispensing of PBS medicines they prescribe or MBS tests they order in a specific clinical area to support quality improvement. Distributed by mail or email.

Activities for whole of practice teams



MedicineInsight visits

Practices and GPs participating in the MedicineInsight program are offered facilitated visits with an NPS MedicineWise Educational Visitor.

Individualised data reports allow GPs to compare their own patterns of prescribing and patient care with national benchmarks and their peers. This data can help inform customised quality improvement activities that align with key areas identified for improvement.



Small group meetings

1-hour facilitated group meeting for up to 10 primary care providers - GPs, pharmacists and nurses - from one practice. Evidence and guidelines are enhanced with aggregate prescribing and practice data from MedicineInsight to align with best practice and identify key areas for improvement.



Webinars

Each topic features a multidisciplinary panel of experts discussing the latest evidence and therapeutic options. Available live, and as on-demand recordings.



Clinical case studies

Participants compare their management of a hypothetical clinical scenario with that of peers.

Immediate feedback and clinical expert commentary are provided to challenge thinking and improve patient care.

Use these with patients to enhance communication, decision-making and disease management - available online and through some clinical software platforms.




MedicineWise app
