

#### **BOOSTERS DOSES**

A booster dose of the COVID-19 vaccine is recommended for everyone in Australia aged 18 years and over, 6 months after their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. A booster dose will give you the most protection against COVID-19 for a longer period of time. **COVID-19 booster doses** If you are 18 years of age or older and have had two doses of your COVID-19 vaccine, you should get a booster dose six months after your second dose.
