1. Why am I using MESALAZINE 1.2 TAKEDA?

MESALAZINE 1.2 TAKEDA contains the active ingredient mesalazine (also called 5-aminosalicylic acid or 5-ASA).

MESALAZINE 1.2 TAKEDA is an antiinflammatory drug used for the treatment of ulcerative colitis. When MESALAZINE 1.2 TAKEDA is taken for a flare up of ulcerative colitis, it acts through the entire colon and rectum to treat the inflammation and reduce symptoms. MESALAZINE 1.2 TAKEDA can also be taken to help prevent reoccurrence of ulcerative colitis.

2. What should I know before I use MESALAZINE 1.2 TAKEDA?

Warnings

Do not use MESALAZINE 1.2 TAKEDA if:

- you are allergic to mesalazine, or any of the ingredients listed at the end of this leaflet.
- you are allergic to a family of drugs known as salicylates (which include aspirin).
- 3. Always check the ingredients to make sure you can use this medicine.

Check with your doctor if you:

- have any kidney problems
- have previously had inflammation of the heart (which may be the result of an infection in the heart)
- have had a previous allergic reaction to MESALAZINE 1.2 TAKEDA or other medicines containing mesalazine or

- sulphasalazine (other medicines taken for treatment of ulcerative colitis)
- have narrowing or blockage of the stomach or the gut
- have skin conditions such as atopic dermatitis or atopic eczema
- have ever developed severe skin rash or skin peeling, blistering and/or mouth
- have any other medical conditions or take any medicines for any other condition

During treatment, you may be at risk of developing certain side effects. It is important you understand these risks and how to monitor for them. See additional information under Section 6. Are there any side effects?
