1. Why am I using SOLIFENACIN VIATRIS?

SOLIFENACIN VIATRIS contains the active ingredient solifenacin succinate.

SOLIFENACIN VIATRIS belongs to a group of medicines called anticholinergic medicines. It works by acting on specialised cells to reduce the activity of your bladder and help you control your bladder.

SOLIFENACIN VIATRIS is used to treat the symptoms of overactive bladder.
