IXAROLA 2.5 mg tablets twice daily along with aspirin 100 mg once daily, is used to:

 prevent major heart related events (stroke, heart attack and death from heart related conditions) if you have poor blood flow in the blood vessels of your heart (coronary artery disease or CAD) and/or arms and legs (peripheral artery disease or PAD).

1. Why am I using IXAROLA?

IXAROLA contains the active ingredient rivaroxaban.

IXAROLA is an anticoagulant. It works by inhibiting the blood

clotting protein called Factor Xa, thus reducing the tendency of blood to form clots.

IXAROLA 10, 15 and 20 mg tablets are used to:

- prevent blood clots in your veins after a hip or knee replacement operation because after an operation you are at an increased risk of getting blood clots
- prevent blood clots in your brain (stroke) and/or other blood
