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1. Why am I using AMISULPRIDE-WGR?

AMISULPRIDE-WGR contains the active ingredient amisulpride. AMISULPRIDE-WGR is an antipsychotic medication.

AMISULPRIDE-WGR is used to treat symptoms of schizophrenia. Schizophrenia is a condition which affects the way you think, feel and/or act. Schizophrenia may cause symptoms such as hallucinations (e.g. hearing, seeing or sensing things which are not there), delusions, unusual suspiciousness, emotional and social withdrawal. People with schizophrenia may also feel depressed, anxious or tense.

2. What should I know before I use AMISULPRIDE-WGR?

Warnings

Do not use AMISULPRIDE-WGR if:

- you are allergic to amisulpride, or any of the ingredients listed at the end of this leaflet. Signs of an allergic reaction may include a skin rash, itching, shortness of breath or swelling of the face, lips or tongue. Always check the ingredients to make sure you can use this medicine.
- you are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed.
- the packaging is torn or shows signs of tampering or the tablets do not look quite right.
- you are taking the following medicines:
 medicines used to treat irregular heart rhythm such as quinidine, disopyramide, amiodarone and sotalol
