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1. Why am I taking SITAGLIPTIN MYLAN?

SITAGLIPTIN MYLAN contains the active ingredient Sitagliptin hydrochloride monohydrate.

SITAGLIPTIN MYLAN is a member of a class of medicines you take by mouth called DPP-4 inhibitors (dipeptidyl peptidase-4 inhibitors) that lowers blood sugar levels in adults with type 2 diabetes mellitus.

SITAGLIPTIN MYLAN is used to lower blood sugar levels in adults with type 2 diabetes mellitus. SITAGLIPTIN MYLAN can be used alone or in combination with certain other medicines that lower blood sugar

along with a recommended diet and exercise program.

2. What should I know before I take SITAGLIPTIN MYLAN?

Warnings

Do not use SITAGLIPTIN MYLAN if:

- you are allergic to Sitagliptin hydrochloride monohydrate, or any of the ingredients listed at the end of this leaflet.
- Always check the ingredients to make sure you can use this medicine.

Check with your doctor if you:

- have or have had type 1 diabetes mellitus.
- have or have had increased ketones in the blood or urine (diabetic ketoacidosis).
- have or have had any kidney problems or any past or present medical problems.
