- to prevent the formation of blood clots in the veins after knee or hip replacement surgery in adults
- to reduce the risk of brain (stroke) and/or other body vessel obstruction by blood clot formation in adults with an abnormal heart beat rhythm called nonvalvular atrial fibrillation
- to treat blood clots in the veins of your legs and lungs and to prevent blood clots from reoccurring in the veins of your legs and/or lungs.

1. Why am I using ARX-Dabigatran?

ARX-Dabigatran contains the active ingredient dabigatran etexilate (as dabigatran etexilate mesilate). ARX-Dabigatran belongs to a group of medicines called anticoagulant. Some people refer to anticoagulant medicines as "blood thinners". Dabigatran works by inhibiting a specific protein in the blood, called thrombin. Thrombin contributes to the formation of blood clots. Dabigatran prevents the formation of blood clots.
